## "Researching American Military Service in the Revolution"

Learn how to research the military service of your ancestors from home via the Internet and databases, ordering records by mail, and other methods. Attendees will learn about: the difference between state militias and Federal troops; how to request service and pension records by mail from the National Archives; databases that include military record information (Ancestry.com, HeritageQuest, Fold3, DAR, etc.) (with examples); Internet sites that can help with research; other sources for information; and societies for descendants of soldiers.

Our speaker, Christine Crawford-Oppenheimer, MLS, has been doing genealogical research since 1979, and has been Vice President for Programs and Vice President for Publicity for the Dutchess County [New York] Genealogical Society since 1988. Ms. Crawford-Oppenheimer's book, Long Distance Genealogy: Researching Your Family History from Home, was published by Betterway Books in 2000.
